Air conditioning

In your room on the wall, you will find the air conditioning remote, which will look like this:



- To turn the air conditioning on or off, you must press the **ON/OFF** button
- Do not change the **Mode** via the **MODE** button, only use the **arrows on the touchpad** to lower or higher the temperature
- To change how strong the stream of air is released by the air conditioning, you must press the **FAN** button and then use the **arrows** to make it stronger or weaker.
- To change the direction of the stream of air you must press the **SWING** button, until you are satisfied with the setting and then press the **ENTER** button.
- To set a timer, you will need to press the **TIMER/CLOCK** button, then press the arrows to set how many hours you want the air conditioning to keep going before automatically shutting off and then press the **ENTER** button.

- **Uffizi - Piazzale degli Uffizi, 6** - <https://www.uffizi.it/gli-uffizi>



The Uffizi Gallery is one of the most renowned Gallery in the world, hosting the likes of Botticelli, Giotto, Piero della Francesca, Raffaello, Michelangelo, Caravaggio and so many more influential painters and sculptors. It is truly a “must-see” when it comes to visiting Florence.

Palazzo Vecchio is the monument that symbolizes the city, functioning not only as a museum but also as the city hall. Be prepared to be astonished by the opulent architecture and art present in the building.

This palace once symbolized the power of de' Medici's family. It was originally purchased by Cosimo I de' Medici in 1550 and was used as a royal residence until 1919 when it was gifted to the State by Vittorio Emanuele III.

Now the palace is divided into five museums, that range from the royal apartments to modern art.

The Giardino di Boboli, right behind Palazzo Pitti, is the perfect place for a relaxing walk.

You'll be surrounded by beautiful sculptures, fountains, and grottos, that will make you feel like you went back in time to the Renaissance.

Villa Bardini is the perfect place to spend a relaxing afternoon. It has a beautiful garden, in which wisterias bloom every April/May, a museum inside the villa and one of the most beautiful views of Florence, that you can enjoy while taking a walk or sitting at their café.

The Cappelle Medicee are part of the church of San Lorenzo. The sculptures used for decorating were designed by Michelangelo, and it served as a crypt. But don't let that fool you, the chapel is entirely decorated in polychrome marble and semi-precious stones.

The majestic bell tower of the Cathedral – also known as “Giotto’s Bell Tower” - is a masterpiece of the Italian Gothic. The view from the tower is something that you must experience at least once in a lifetime, but beware, there is no lift, so you’ll have to walk to the top.

Orsanmichele



The niches on the exterior of Orsanmichele's impressive building in pietra forte were adorned with sculptures commissioned from the most famous fifteenth- and sixteenth-century Florentine artists. Today, the versions you see outside are copies, and the original sculptures can be found on the first floor of Orsanmichele's museum.

While walking

While walking through the streets of Florence, you must stop and take a look at these iconic landmarks:

Ponte vecchio



Ponte Vecchio is the historic bridge over the Arno River, in. The bridge connects Via Por Santa Maria to via de' Guicciardini. This is the only bridge in Florence spared from destruction during the Second World War.

Piazza della passera

This small square will offer you some amazing food, ranging from trippa, to ice cream, to specialty coffee. All while enjoying the relaxing atmosphere of this hidden place.



Il Porcellino - Piazza del Mercato Nuovo

This fountain in the middle of the city center has a secret: put a coin in his mouth and rub his snout. If the coin falls inside the grate where the water of the fountain drains it will bring you great luck



Piazzale Michelangelo

If you go to Piazzale Michelangelo, you can enjoy a wonderful panoramic view of Florence for free.



Loggia dei Lanzi – Piazza Signoria

Loggia dei Lanzi is a free public museum situated right next to Palazzo Vecchio

Pisa

By taking a train from the station of Santa Maria Novella in Florence to Pisa Centrale (every 40 minutes a train leaves for the city of Pisa). In an hour you will be in this magnificent city, where you can admire the following monuments:

Piazza del Duomo (also called Piazza dei Miracoli):



Where the Baptistery, the Camposanto and the leaning Tower of Pisa are located

Palazzo blu

One of Pisa's most important museums, situated inside an ancient noble mansion.

Murales di Keith Haring

Near the station you can find a mural made by Keith Haring in 1989 as a gift to the city of Pisa.

It is located in P.za V. Emanuele II, 18, PI



Chiesa di Santa Maria della Spina



The Church is an extraordinary example of Pisan Gothic, the small church of Santa Maria della Spina was built in 1230 on the Arno's bank in correspondence to the Ponte Nuovo, which united Via Santa Maria and Via Sant'Antonio, the bridge was destroyed in the XV century.

Piazza dei cavalieri

Piazza dei Cavalieri was the political center of the Republic of Pisa, it was later transformed by Cosimo I de' Medici into the headquarters of the new military order of Saint Stephen, as an attempt to remove from the city any trace of the former republic.



Arsenali di Pisa

The Arsenals were built almost 400 years ago by Grand Duke Cosimo I de' Medici's will. He wanted to strengthen his naval power and resuscitate the ancient glories of Pisa Maritime Republic

Viareggio

By taking a train from the station of Santa Maria Novella directed to Viareggio, in about an hour and a half you can enjoy a relaxing day at the beach and explore the city.

Carnevale di Viareggio



-If you have the chance, we advise visiting Viareggio during February, as it's the month of the Carnevale (the dates of the parade vary every year).

The Carnival of Viareggio was born in 1873 when there was the first parade of festively decorated carriages in the historic Via Regia, the heart of the old town. It was transferred to the Promenade at the beginning of the twentieth century, and it has grown in size and popularity year after year. Today, the carriages are more than 20 meters high and 12 meters wide but remain made of papier-mâché as per tradition.

The Carnival of Viareggio fills a whole month of daytime and nighttime festivities with parades of allegorical floats, local parties, masked balls, and festivals of all kinds.

It is truly an experience of a lifetime where you can immerse yourself in a joyous and surreal environment, while also tasting the traditional food of this festivity.

Pineta di Ponente



While Viareggio is mostly known for its beaches, it also has a vast park in the city center. It's perfect to take a relaxing walk, especially in the summer as the tall pines provide shade and shield from the intense heat. In the park you can also find multiple establishments that vary from ice cream shops to sports centers. It also sometimes hosts the street market and concerts.

La Passeggiata di Viareggio

La Passeggiata di Viareggio è uno dei luoghi più suggestivi in tutta la Versilia. Una lunga via che si estende per oltre 2 km con molteplici edifici in stile Liberty, negozi, ristoranti e caffè.

The Promenade of Viareggio is one of the most suggestive places in Versilia. It's a 2 km street with multiple Liberty buildings, stores, restaurants, and cafes.



Siena

By taking a train from the station of Santa Maria Novella in Florence to Siena, in an hour and forty minutes you will be in this magnificent city, where you can admire the following monuments:

Piazza del Campo



Piazza del campo is Siena's most important square, known for its peculiar shape, usually referred as almost seashell like. In the square you can find the "Palazzo pubblico" which houses both the "Museo Civico" and the "Torre del Mangia".

It also hosts "Il Palio" which is a traditional competition of horseback riding that was instituted in 1238 and has been celebrated every year since.

Palazzo pubblico di Siena

The Palazzo pubblico of Siena was built between 1297 and 1311, during the "Governo dei Nove". This beautiful gothic palace was originally built to host Siena's civic institutions and to this day it still serves that very same purpose. You can also find in its first floor the Museo civico.



Museo civico di Siena



The Museo Civico of Siena has a collection of frescos done by the **most important painters of the pictorial school of Siena from the year 1300 to the year 1800. Also displaying some of the most renown gothic artists of Europe.**

Torre del mangia

The Torre del mangia is one of the tallest ancient towers of Italy, its particular name derives from the nickname “Mangia Guadagni” (literally translates to earnings eater) given to the first bell ringer of the tower, Giovanni di Balducci, who was known for recklessly spending enormous amounts of money.



Tickets and Opening/Closing Times =

From the 1st of November to the 28th of February=

Duomo di Siena



The Duomo di Santa Maria Assunta, Siena Cathedral, is one of the most important and magnificent Romanesque-Gothic churches in Italy.

During the Middle Ages Siena was at the height of its powers, that lead to a desire for an even larger Cathedral; the dream vanished due to the plague of 1348, that diminished the population. Traces of this ambitious project are still visible in the remnants of its columns and the incomplete façade.

Tickets and Opening/Closing Times =

From the 1st of April to the 31st of October:

- 10 am – 7 pm

From the 1st of November to the 31st of March:

- 10:30 am – 5:30 pm

Sunday and Holiday:

Arezzo

By taking a train from the station of Santa Maria Novella in Florence to Arezzo, in an hour and a half you will be in this magnificent city, where you can admire the following monuments:

Piazza Grande



Piazza Grande is the most important square in Arezzo, it is known for its slanted trapezoidal shape and usually hosts the “Giostra del Saracino” a medieval horse competition that is celebrated to this day, usually two times a year (in June and September).

Basilica di San Francesco

The basilica of Saint Francis is one of the most important churches of Arezzo. Inside it hosts a series of frescos called “Storia della vera croce” (The story of the real cross) done by Piero della Francesca one of the most important figures of the Italian Renaissance.

Fortezza Medicea

While the towns are mostly known for their beautiful coastlines and the crystal-clear water, there are several hiking trails which have an astounding view of both the

coast and the natural landscape of the Cinque Terre

To get to Cinque Terre, you need to take the train from the station of Firenze Santa Maria Novella to La Spezia Centrale and then get another train from La Spezia Centrale to the town you want to visit.
